b) Business Arising from the minutes

5. Presentation by Angela Coleman, General Manager of Conservation Ontario

Angela Coleman has been the General Manager since September 2022, but has worked for Conservation Authorities for 20 years. She provided a presentation titled "Adding Value Where it Matters Most."

The presentation discussed the general structure of Conservation Authorities, the role of Conservation Ontario (CO) including the important role of advocacy on behalf of for Conservation Authorities. She mentioned the role of the Conservation Authority board s in the Section 28 regulations, especially as it relates to hearings.

Board members had many questions about various budget lines, and capital requirements. There was a discussion about shifting some of the capital levy increase

to decrease the levy to the City for 2024. The Members agreed to approve the budget as amended.
